KAAM Youth Program KANG (Korean American Next Generation) Leaders

The KAAM Youth program, KANG (Korean American Next Generation) Leaders was started by a special donation. The first meeting was held on April 28 (Sat) at Korean Presbyterian Church. About 32 Korean teenagers and their parents participated in the theme of "identity and leadership". A separate meeting for parents was also held to provide information on their children's education, career information, interest and concerns. In addition, there was a demonstration of kumdo and a performance of Korean traditional instruments.





The second meeting, 'College Career Workshop', was held at KAAM Center on Saturday, July 22. About 20 students and parents participated and dealed with college search, college apply, scholarships and financial aid.

On Monday, July 30, Kang Leaders also met with soccer player Son Heung-min (English Premier League Tottenham Hotspur) at US Bank Stadium for greetings, encouragement and support. He has visited Minnesota for the International Championship Cup match against Tottenham vs AC Milan on Tuesday, July 31. After a practice game on Monday July 30, Son spent time with KANG leaders youths and took photos together, provided autographs and gave KAAM his scoccer ball with his autogragh on it. We look forward to continuing the activities of Kang Leaders and hope that more Korean youths can participate.

Growing up in Minnesota, I often felt that the Korean American community here was small and that there were limited structured opportunity to engage with a broad range of Korean American youth. I would have loved to have Korean American who could talk through fears, hopes and dreams with me. As we piloted KANG Leads Program this year, we sought to build strong foundation to provide these opportunities. We endeavored to bring Koreans Americans with different backgrounds to share their common interests and realize their potential. In the future, I hope to further develop teamwork skills through service projects. We are Korean-Americans regardless of our ability to speak Korean, our knowledge of Korean culture, where we were born and raised, where we are. Based on this, I hope to be able to join together as a community that can proudly assert its identity as a Korean-American.


2018 Summer History/Culture Camp

Student Data Disaggregation Law

Along with Minnesota Chinese Community, KAAM met with Minnesota Senators on April 12 to express concerns about the student data ethnic disaggregation law.

Minnesota is one of the states that have passed legislation to classify student data for all public schools by ethnic to get understanding of their educational needs. As a result, students in minority groups, including American Indian / Alaska Native, Asian, Black / African American, and Hispanic / Latino, must answer questions about subcategories within their ethnic group. However, there are concerns that this is not appropriate to understand the educational needs of students. (Concerns: Defining stereotypes about ethnic minorities as 'foreigners' / discrimination / academic achievement of students influenced not only race but health, residential environment, parental education / Lack of participation or opinion gathering, etc.)



This law will start in five districts of Minnesota in 2018-19, and will be implemented across the entire school district in 2019-20.
