The 28th Scholarship Award Ceremony this year was held at the Hilton Hotel in Minneapolis on March 19th at 5PM. Scholarships ranging from \$1,500 to \$2,000 were awarded to 9 high school seniors, and there were 90 participants and guests for the event. Along with a buffet dinner, St. Paul Chamber Orchestra's founder and violinist Professor Young-Nam Kim and his daughter Professor Ariana Kim, who is also a violin and gayageum player, performed. MAKA invited Don H. Liu who is a vice president of Target and general manager of the legal team, as a mentor speaker, delivered a message of hope that encourages young Korean Americans to unfold within American society towards a "bigger dream" with pride and identity as a Korean. This year, MAKA was able to receive more than \$26,000 as a donation and scholarship sponsorship including \$500 from the KAAM. MAKA will continue to support young Korean American through scholarship opportunities and also mentoring and networking for our next generations. 2023 MN Korean Golf Tournament Jae Won Kim | MN Korean Golf Association Chair

Hello Korean American residents in Minnesota!

I am Jaewon Kim, the Chairman of the 2023 Korean Golf Association (KGA) in Minnesota. We also recently elected Tae Joon Park as the 4th president of the Korean Sports Association in Minnesota (KSA) followed by Hyeong-ho Han, Geum-seop Lee, and Hwan-shik Hwang. I am deeply grateful to the former presidents who have maintained and developed the KSA with undiminished passion and dedication since 2003.

To commemorate the inauguration of the new president, a golf tournament <KSA President's Cup> was held at the White Eagle Golf Club on Saturday, May 20th. 82 golfers (61 males/21 females) participated and successfully finished in perfect weather. In particular, Pro golfer Soo-Sung Ko made the first hole-in-one of his careers, and it became the highlight of the tournament. He donated his hole-in-one prize to the auction and the auction profits were transferred to a KSA sports fund.

Another purpose of this tournament was to raise funds for participating in the 22nd National Korean Athletics Championships (June 23-25) in New York this year and to select players for next year's national golf tournament. A total of \$2300 was raised through the support of many people including KAAM, a lottery prize event, and this fund will be used by the KSA and the KGA. I sincerely thank all the supporters. The Korean Golf Tournament will be held at the same location on Saturday, May 18, 2024, and I hope golfers who were unable to attend this year can participate next year.

Special Event: < Minnesota Korean Day> Festival

May is <Cultural Heritage Month for Asian Americans>, and on Sunday, March 26, an opening ceremony was held at the newly opened <American Veterans Memorial Park> in Cannon Falls. On the expansive 100-acre site, a memorial to veterans and various cultural facilities will be built, making the park the largest memorial park in the United States. KAAM president, Yong Hyeok Lee gave a congratulatory speech on this day. The land donor, Toufong Lor, donated an acre of land to the KAAM, and the KAAM plans to erect a <Octagonal Pavilion> memorial to commemorate Korea's representative veterans as the first phase of the project. On Sunday, May 14, the opening ceremony of <US Veterans Memorial Park> in Canon Falls, Minnesota, was held with many attendees. It was to celebrate the completion of the first phase of the nearly 100-acre project. The event was accompanied by retired U.S. military officials and local civic leaders and military flights. "We want to honor and remember the 58,000 veterans who are missing, dead, or sacrificed for America in every moment of their lives," said donor and founder Toufong Lor, who donated this vast property. On this day, KAAM president Yong Hyeok Lee also attended the event on behalf of the Korean American communities in Minnesota.



The opening events started on May 14 and continued until May 29. The <Minnesota Korean Day> celebration was held from 11:00am to 3:00pm on Sunday, May 21. During the event, traditional and modern K-culture were presented. Performers were from Jangmi Arts, MKDC, K-move, Origin, Finesse and Lee's Champion Taekwondo Academy. Also, many individual performers and staff enriched the event including Kim Kang-min (stage director), Lee Su-jin (gayageum player), Brandon Lee (actor and model) and Kyung-hun Park (MC).

KAAM also provided various traditional games. It was another successful event KAAM hosted this year and KAAM will continue to work hard to introduce and inform about the proud Korean cultural heritage.

That represents that the KAAM continues to communicate and cooperate with the Consulate General in Chicago. He praised KAAM's great services to Korean American communities in Minnesota. KAAM will continue to develop and provide various benefits for Koreans communities.

The Consulate General in Chicago is not sure about the visitation plan for the second half of the year, but they will make a decision soon depending on the budget situation of the Office of Overseas Koreans in the home country and will notify KAAM about the decision.
