<Bina's Six Apples>

A Children's Theatre Company Production Original World Premiere Production

Bina's Six Apples, written by Lloyd Suh and directed by Eric Ting is rooted in family lore. It is inspired by the author's parents, and what they experienced as children during the Korean War, but it is also equally inspired by his kids - not just in the remarkable differences in how they're growing up, but in the similarities, too. Mr. Suh said that his greatest ambition for the play is that it speaks to both generations: their emotions, their imaginations, their sense of discovery and journey towards empathy. The play was written for young audiences but also for their parents and grandparents.

Bina's family grows the finest apples in all of Korea. But when war forces her to flee her home, Bina is alone in the world with just six precious apples to her name. Bina goes on a journey that ranges from the heartbreaking to the humorous. Encountering new challenges at every turn, Bina is forced to rely upon her apples and their meaningful legacy as she begins to discover the power of her own resilience. Often mesmerizing, always heartwarming, Bina realizes she's not the only one on a difficult quest for a place to call home.

Bina's Six Apples is sweet, soulful, and ripe with symbolism. Pioneer Press reported, Bina's Six Apples is a very good play,



and the Children's Theater Company has made an excellent production. It may take place in 1950, but it's themes of war and displacement are happening around the world even now. As we are all currently tempted to curse the fate of a pandemic, this show could offer a welcome sense of perspective.

Bina's Six Apples is a co-production with Children's Theater Company and played from January 11 through February 13, 2022.


Online Challenge: March First 'Samil' Movement Day

She is running for Minnesota House of Representatives in 36A because she cares deeply about her community. DFL candidate Susie Strom, if elected, would be the first Korean adoptee House member.

The 72nd Anniversary of the Korean War | Sejin Song, AKUS Minnesota Chairman



Chairman Sejin Song was discharged as a colonel in the Republic of Korea Army in 2000. During the service he said, "I would like to commemorate the sacrifice and hard work of the 94,964 American soldiers who fought to protect the Republic of Korea from communism, especially the Minnesotan soldiers who participated in the Korean War." He read all the names of the American soldier's names on the Korean War monument. Along with a salute to both the American and Korean national flags, both national anthems were also sung. There were chrysanthemums at eight monuments and a big wreath at the center of the monuments.

In the midst of the trumpet call, he announced a moment of silence to remember and appreciate the sacrifices of the Korean War veterans. The Korean American Association of Minnesota (KAAM) supported this service by providing both American and Korean flags and by promoting this memorial service to the Korean community. Some Americans who watched the event expressed their gratitude. One person said that he was moved by reading <Battle of Jangjinho>, a book about the Korean War. This memorial service was to remember the history of Korea and to commemorate the souls of the veterans. He said the event will be continued every year.

KAAM Korean Language Class


