Overseas Elections for the 21st Presidential Election

From Thursday, May 22 to Saturday, May 24, Overseas Election for the 21st presidential election was held over three days at the KAAM Center. According to the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea in Chicago, which oversees four overseas polling stations in its jurisdiction, a total of 3,905 ballots were cast, recording the highest-ever voter turnout of 73.7% (out of 5,301 registered voters).

Given that this overseas election was organized and conducted within a short period of time, the results are being viewed even more positively. Consul Changho Woo of the Overseas Election Commission of the Chicago Consulate General expressed his appreciation, stating, *"We sincerely thank the overseas Koreans living in our jurisdiction for their great interest and active participation in the 21st presidential overseas election. We ask for your continued interest and participation in future overseas elections."*



Consular Services in Collaboration with KAAM

On Friday, June 6, from 9:30 AM to 2:30 PM, the Consulate General of the Republic of Korea in Chicago provided consular services at the KAAM Center for the convenience of Korean residents in Minnesota and nearby regions. While priority was given to those who registered online in advance, the consular team also did their utmost to accommodate walk-in visitors who were unable to register beforehand, handling their requests as promptly and sincerely as possible to minimize inconvenience.

In addition to Vice Consul Hyunmin Kim and two staff members, Consul Raeduck Park visited Minnesota and joined key community leaders for a luncheon meeting. Together, they discussed ways to further strengthen business and corporate partnerships between Korea and Minnesota, as well as shared visions for broader global cooperation. The KAAM remains committed to offering ongoing opportunities to serve and support not only the Korean community in Minnesota, but also contributing to the continued development of partnerships between Korea and Minnesota.

A highlight of the evening was a keynote address by Catherine Kim, who grew up in Minnesota and currently serves as Executive Vice President of Editorial

Minnesota Project 70th Anniversary Celebration

From Friday, June 20 to Sunday, June 22, the 34th Council Meeting of the Seoul National University Alumni Association in the USA (SNUAA) was held at the historic St. Paul Hotel in Minnesota. This year’s event was especially significant as it coincided with the 70th anniversary of the sisterhood between the University of Minnesota and Seoul National University, marking a momentous occasion with celebratory programs throughout the weekend.

This was also the inaugural event presided over by the Association’s 18th President, Hyosook Hwang, a distinguished SNU alumna and former President of KAAM.

A highlight of the event was the unprecedented delegation from Korea, including SNU President Honglim Yoo, SNU Global Alumni Association President Jongsub Kim, and over a dozen prominent representatives from the university. In addition, major figures from the University of Minnesota attended, including Vice President Priya, symbolizing the enduring partnership between the two institutions.

The keynote address was delivered by Mr. Hak Cheol Shin, CEO of LG Chem and Executive Vice Chair of 3M, a highly respected figure in both the Korean-American community and the global business world. His inspiring speech received an enthusiastic response from the audience.

The weekend began with a Friday evening cultural prelude featuring a gayageum performance by Dr. Sujin Lee, followed by a powerful pansori performance by alumna Hyejin Lee, who traveled from Korea to attend. Saturday’s program captivated attendees with a special father-daughter duo performance by the world-renowned



Professor Young-Nam Kim and Professor Ariana Kim, titled “Just Dad and Me,” which highlighted the cultural celebration of the Minnesota Project’s legacy.

At Friday’s Minnesota Project Workshop, SNU alumni from across the United States gathered for an in-depth session exploring the impact of the Minnesota Project on Korea’s post-war development—often credited as a cornerstone of the “Miracle on the Han River.” Conducted from 1955 to 1962 with USAID support, the Minnesota Project saw the University of Minnesota assist Seoul National University in modernizing its education and research infrastructure, particularly in engineering, agriculture, medicine, and nursing. Later, the program expanded to include veterinary medicine and public administration, helping lay the foundation for Korea’s rapid modernization.

Participants also toured the University of Minnesota campus, reflecting on its historical contributions to Korean higher education. Despite the summer heat, many attendees wrapped up the weekend with a friendly round of golf at Rush Creek Golf Club in Maple Grove—the same course where Se Ri Pak famously claimed victory.

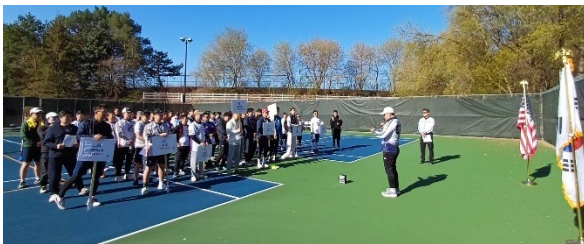


1st Minnesota Sports Council President’s Cup Jokgu Tournament

On Saturday, April 25, from 9 AM to 5 PM at the Bass Lake Tennis Courts, the 1st Minnesota Sports Council President’s Cup Jokgu Tournament was held with great success as the first nationwide jokgu tournament in the U.S. for 2025. A total of 13 teams and over 80 players from 8 cities competed in a day of spirited matches. After the preliminary rounds, the top six teams advanced to the Elite Division including Minnesota Team A, while the remaining seven teams competed in the Open Division including Minnesota Team B. Dallas Team A claimed the championship title in the Elite Division. Minnesota Team A (Jae Hyun Park, Won Joon Choi, Yeon Lee, and Hong Chul Shin) fell just short in a close 2:1 match against New York Team. However, Minnesota Team

B (Tae Joon Park, Sung Jin Yoon, Kwang Il Seo, and Jin Wook Kim) earned second place in the Open Division. In his congratulatory remarks, Mr. Dae Jae Lee, President of the Korea Jokgu Association, reaffirmed the association's commitment to globalizing Korea’s traditional sport of jokgu through strong international partnerships. Mr. Tae Joon Park, the newly inaugurated 2nd President of the Minnesota Sports Council, expressed his deep honor in hosting the tournament—not only as the president but as a jokgu player himself. He also pledged the Minnesota Sports Council’s continued support for the growth of jokgu in the state. With the tournament season off to an exciting start, expectations are high for upcoming jokgu competitions across the nation.

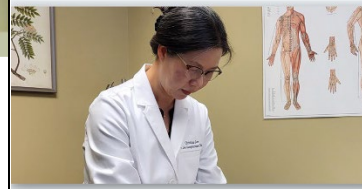
